## Jobs, Talent, and Learning

Are you looking for a job? Do you know someone who's looking for a job? Are you looking for someone to join your team? Do you just like to spend time looking at job postings?

If you answered yes to any of the above questions, you might want to check out the NIRI [Career Center](#). Perhaps not surprisingly, the Career Center is one of the most popular destinations on the NIRI website.

About 100 available IR and IR-related jobs are currently posted. They include both entry-level and senior-level jobs and some in between. Jobs are available from employers around the United States.

Job seekers can also post their resumes, which makes them searchable by employers seeking talent. There is no charge to post your resume, and hundreds of IR practitioners have done so. Employers make frequent use of posted resumes as they conduct searches.

Speaking of talent, the September-October edition of *IR Update* magazine includes an [article](#) about IR career transitions. The magazine also includes a terrific [article](#) about legendary recruiter Smooch Reynolds, who was recently named a NIRI Fellow.

Because job transitions are in all too frequent feature of life in the investor relations profession, you might want to take note of the NIRI [Career Transition Program](#), which assists NIRI members who become unemployed. The program suspends national member dues for a period of up to 12 months at the end of their current membership term. Members will continue to receive national member benefits.

Members must be unemployed and active, dues-paying members at the time of application. This program is not retroactive for previous periods of unemployment, and does not cover senior roundtable or chapter dues. If members are re-employed during the dues suspension, they are expected to renew their paid membership with

NIRI at that time. Approval is conditional upon NIRI review and qualification for the program.
